Looking forward to the IAAF World Indoor Championships Birmingham 2018 and IAAF/Trinidad Alfonso World Half Marathon Championships Valencia 2018

There's just a matter of days to go until the first two IAAF World Athletics Series events of 2018.

First up is the **IAAF World Indoor Championships Birmingham 2018** which will get underway later this week. It will be the second time that Birmingham has hosted the event, having done so in 2003, and comes just seven months after the UK hosted the IAAF World Championships London 2017.

Following the conclusion of the **IAAF World Indoor Tour**, 11 athletes secured wild cards for Birmingham, joining the 11 World Indoor Tour winners from last year.

Just a few weeks after the World Indoor Championships closing ceremony, the focus of attention will shift to Spain for the IAAF/Trinidad Alfonso World Half Marathon Championships Valencia 2018.

Some major names – including defending champion Geoffrey Kamworor and world record-holder Joyciline Jepkosgei – have already confirmed their intention to compete in Valencia, so it will most likely be another memorable event.

The 213th IAAF Council Meeting will take place at the Birmingham City Council House at the end of the IAAF World Indoor Championships Birmingham 2018 on Monday 5 and Tuesday 6 March 2018.
