Looking ahead to...the best of indoor and XC action

The end of January witnesses the start of the nine meeting <u>IAAF Indoor Permit season 2010</u> commencing with the oldest indoor event of them all, the 103rd edition of the Millrose Games in New York, USA on 29 January, and concluding in Liévin, France on 5 March. And just as the indoor halls of the northern hemisphere are set to buzz with excitement, so also commences the second half of the IAAF Cross Country Permit season 2009/2010, which began in Oeiras, Portugal, on 21 November 2009 and ends in Albufeira, Portugal on 7 March 2010. The Cinque Mulini in San Vittore Olona, Italy, which celebrates its 78th edition on 31 January, is as revered a name in cross country running as the Millrose is in indoor athletics, and is the seventh of this season's series of 12 Permit meetings.

Both indoor and XC seasons climax with IAAF World Athletics Series events: 13th IAAF World Indoor Championships, Doha, QAT from 12-14 March and 38th IAAF World Cross Country Championships, Bydgoszcz, POL on 28 March.

Looking ahead to...road racing

With two of this year's six IAAF World Athletics Series events, the World Indoor Championships in Doha, Qatar and the World Cross Country Championships in Bydgoszcz, Poland, having recently been spectacularly played out, we now turn our attentions to road racing, both running and race walking.

We have entered a concentrated period in the IAAF Road Race Label Event calendar. On 21 March in Lisbon (POR), Eritrea's Zersenay Tadese powered to World records over 20km and Half Marathon (both pending the usual ratification procedures), and we now eagerly await major city marathons in Paris (FRA), Boston (USA) and London (GBR), which are Gold Label events.

The IAAF Race Walking Challenge moves into full swing next month, as following on from four Area permit races whose results also count for the final standings, on 10 April the first of this year's IAAF permit races, the 19° Grande Premio Internacional en Marcha Atletica, will be held in Rio Maior (POR).

A replacement for the former Golden League of 6 meetings which were staged only in Europe, the new 14 meeting IAAF Diamond League series achieves one of the strategic goals of the IAAF, which is to enhance the worldwide appeal of Athletics, by taking this top tier of the one-day circuit outside Europe for the first time with competitions in Asia, Europe, the Middle East and the USA. Amongst the other innovations of this new league is that athletes from 32 different event disciplines can take part, thanks to a careful distribution of the events amongst the different meetings, and in each of the disciplines there will be a "Diamond Race" with points available throughout the season.
