Looking ahead to the outdoor season

As the busy month of March draws to a close, athletes are already gearing up for the peak of an action-packed outdoor season.

The first Gold level meeting on the <u>World Athletics Continental Tour</u> will soon get under way as Bermuda hosts the opening meeting in the series on 9 April. The <u>Wanda Diamond League</u>, meanwhile, kicks off just five weeks later when Doha hosts the traditional curtain-riaser on 13 May. And the first outdoor meeting of the year on the <u>World Athletics Combined Events Tour</u> is due to take place at the end of April with the Multistars meeting in Grosseto.

All of the roads on these tours, of course, will naturally lead to the **World Athletics Championships Oregon22** from 15-24 July.



World Athletics Indoor Championships Belgrade 22 ends on a high

Three world records on the final day of competition, combined with a record number of countries qualifying for finals, ensured that the World Athletics Indoor Championships Belgrade 22 ended on a high.

Over the three days of thrilling action in Belgrade, Serbia, from 18-20 March, 129 teams competed and athletes from 59 countries lined up in finals (57 countries contended for medals in 2017). Seven championship records and 17 area records were set. **Full story**
