Looking ahead to action on the roads and cross country

With almost all international track and field action having concluded for the year, the focus of the sport shifts to the end-of-year road running season and cross-country action.

There has already been a world marathon record from Eliud Kipchoge in Berlin, and the World Athletics Cross Country Tour got under way earlier this month. These terrains will provide the bulk of international athletics action for the next few months, building into a 2023 season that will feature the World Cross Country Championships and World Road Running Championships.

The World Athletics Championships Budapest 23 timetable features 14 action-packed stadium sessions, to be held from 19-27 August in the Hungarian capital.
