Looking forward to outdoor action

The curtains have closed on the **World Athletics Indoor Tour** for another year and 11 series winners have been declared, all of whom receive a wildcard entry to the **World Athletics Indoor Championships Belgrade 22**.

The focus has started to turn to outdoor action in many parts of the world and the **World Athletics Continental Tour** is already underway with two competitions having taken place in the past month.

There also looks set to be a steady stream of <u>Label road races</u> set to take place in the coming months, while the <u>World</u> <u>Athletics Challenge - Race Walking</u> will get underway in April, then the <u>World Athletics Challenge - Combined Events</u> will resume two weeks later.

And it won't be long before the top tier of one-day competitions - the <u>Wanda Diamond League</u> and the <u>World Athletics</u> <u>Continental Tour Gold</u> series - begin in earnest.
