
Looking forward to the announcement of the IAAF Athletes of the Year 2018

The IAAF Athlete of the Year finalists have been announced and the winners will be revealed at the **IAAF Athletics Awards 2018** on 2 December in Monaco.

Other awards – including the Performance of the Year, the Coaching Achievement Award, the Rising Stars of the Year, the Woman of the Year, the President's Award, and the Photograph of the Year – will be presented on the night as the athletics world looks back on another memorable year for the sport.

The IAAF Athletics Awards 2018 will take place on the evening of Tuesday 4 December at the end of the second day of the 215th IAAF Council Meeting.

NASSAU PASSES THE BATON TO YOKOHAMA FOR IAAF WORLD RELAYS 2019

Japan will now host two of the biggest events on the athletics calendar in successive years after the IAAF Council voted this week to award the 2019 IAAF World Relays to Yokohama.

Already preparing to host the 2020 Olympic Games in Tokyo, Japan will now welcome the athletics world a year earlier, when it holds the IAAF World Relays in Yokohama International Stadium on 11-12 May next year.

After The Bahamas Government confirmed that it would no longer be able to offer the financial guarantee that underpinned the event in Nassau, several member federations contacted the IAAF directly to express their interest in hosting the 2019 World Relays. **Full story**

IAAF World Athletics Championships Doha 2019 timetable and qualification system published

New regulations for IAAF road races and introduction of a 'Platinum Label'



Significant changes have been made to the regulations for IAAF Label road races from 2019 to improve the quality of events for the athletes who take part and the fans that follow them.

Stay of regulations to suppress testosterone levels agreed by IAAF in exchange for expedited CAS hearing



The IAAF has agreed to delay the implementation of its Eligibility Regulations for the Female Classification (Athletes with differences of sex development (DSD)) from November to March, to avoid further delay in the proceedings brought by Mokgadi Caster Semenya and Athletics South Africa (ASA) challenging their legality.
