# Looking forward to the Wanda Diamond League final

In little more than a week from now, the Wanda Diamond League will reach its climax with a two-day final from 8-9 September in Zurich.

Many of the world's best athletes – from newly crowned Olympic champions to world record-breakers – have confirmed their attendance in Zurich where they will compete for not just a \$30,000 bonus but also a wildcard entry to the World Athletics Championships Oregon 22.

Before that, though, there's one more opportunity to bank points in the series as the Diamond League circuit moves to Brussels on 3 September before heading to Zurich five days later.



## Record figures at Tokyo Olympics highlights global reach of athletics

World Athletics President Sebastian Coe has hailed the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games and the people of Japan for allowing the dreams of the world's athletes to come to life at what has proven to be the most globally successful edition of the Games for athletics.

A record 83 teams reached finals in Tokyo, highlighting the global reach of the sport, with 43 teams featuring on the medal podium and 23 of those winning gold.

Some 70% of athletes only get one chance to compete at the Olympic Games and in Tokyo athletes made the most of the opportunity under the most challenging circumstances.
