Looking forward to the return of competition

As several countries are beginning to ease their lockdown restrictions, competition organisers are starting to look at alternative ways of holding athletics competitions.

Standard competitions and races may still be some way off, but the <u>Ultimate Garden Clash - Pole Vault Edition</u> will whet the appetite of athletes and fans alike.

On Sunday 3 May world record-holder Mondo Duplantis of Sweden, two-time world champion Sam Kendricks of the USA and 2012 Olympic champion Renaud Lavillenie of France will be connected via a live video link as they compete from the comfort and safety of their own back gardens in a unique competition that will be streamed on the <u>World Athletics YouTube</u> <u>channel</u>.



World Athletics creates fund to support athletes during the pandemic

World Athletics, together with the International Athletics Foundation (IAF), has today launched a US\$500,000 fund to support professional athletes experiencing financial hardship due to the coronavirus pandemic.

World Athletics President Sebastian Coe, who also chairs the IAF, said the fund would be used to assist athletes who have lost most of their income in the last few months due to the suspension of international competition while the world combats the global health emergency.
