# Looking forward to the World Athletics Half Marathon Championships Gdynia 2020

Following the postponement of the World Indoor Championships, the <u>World Athletics Half Marathon Championships</u> <u>Gdynia 2020</u> will be the first global athletics championships of the year.

The event, which will take place on 29 March 2020, will attract some of the world's best distance runners, including the likes of world 10,000m and cross-country champion Joshua Cheptegei, who recently broke the world 5km record in Monaco with 12:51.

In addition, the event will provide an opportunity for 30,000 recreational runners to line up alongside the world's best as they run around Gdynia before finishing on the city's beach and claiming a unique medal.



## World Athletics modifies rules governing competition shoes for elite athletes

World Athletics has amended its rules governing competition shoes to provide greater clarity to athletes and shoe manufacturers around the world and to protect the integrity of the sport.

The rule amendments that the World Athletics Council has approved were recommended by its Assistance Review Group, an internal working group containing technical, scientific and legal experts as well as athlete representatives.
