Looking forward to the New Year


It may be a year that many people would rather forget, but 2020 also produced dozens of memorable moments in the world of athletics, many of which were celebrated at the recent **World Athletics Awards 2020**.

As the year draws to a close, there is much cause for optimism in the New Year. Not only will it be an Olympic year (albeit a rescheduled one), but two other World Athletics Series events will take place in 2021: the <u>World Athletics Relays in Silesia</u> on 1-2 May and the <u>World Athletics U20 Championships in Nairobi on 17-22 August</u>.

And of course, throughout the year the world's leading athletes will compete in various annual series such as the <u>Wanda</u> <u>Diamond League</u>, the <u>World Athletics Continental Tour</u>, the <u>World Athletics Indoor Tour</u>, <u>Label road races</u>, <u>Cross</u> <u>Country Permit meetings</u>, and the World Athletics Challenges for <u>Combined Events</u> and <u>Race Walking</u>.

Adding in various area championships across a range of age groups and surfaces, 2021 is set to be a busy and enthralling year for the sport.

No doubt there will also be some challenges along the way, but with the resilience shown by many within the sport over the past 12 months, athletics will find ways of not only surviving, but thriving.



Duplantis and Rojas named World Athletes of the Year

World record-breakers Mondo Duplantis of Sweden and Yulimar Rojas of Venezuela have been named the male and female World Athletes of the Year at the World Athletics Awards 2020, a ceremony held virtually on 5 December.

Duplantis broke the world record in the pole vault twice, topping 6.17m and 6.18m on back-to-back weekends in February just a few weeks before the global coronavirus pandemic ground the sporting world to a halt. When competition finally resumed, Duplantis capped his season and produced the highest outdoor vault of all time (6.15m) and finished the year undefeated in 16 competitions.

Like many athletes, Rojas competed sparingly in 2020, but she made each of her appearances count. Rojas broke the South American indoor triple jump record in her first competition of the year, reaching 15.03m in Metz, France. In her next competition, at the World Athletics Indoor Tour


