

## BIOGRAPHIES



**Dr. Primo Nebiolo (ITA)**

*Honorary Editorial Board*

*Primo Nebiolo was born in Turin on July 14, 1923. With a Degree in Law, he is executive and chairman of a number of companies, particularly in the field of construction. He started his athletic activity as a boy and soon distinguished himself in the long jump. After an interruption during the war, he immediately took a place among the best jumpers in the nation, ranking among the top ten long jumpers of the year for three years in a row. In 1947, he won the second series Italian Championships and the University Championships. In the same year, he started his managerial career with the Turin Sports Centre (CUS), after having competed for "Gancia" and "Lancia". In 1949, he became a Member of the management, and in 1953, of the Executive Committee of the Italian University Sports Centre (CUSI). In 1959, he was elected Vice-Chairman of*

*FISU, the most important international Body for Sports at a University level. He was elected its President 1961 in Sofia, a position which has been confirmed every two years since then and which he still holds. He organized the Summer University Games in 1959, the Winter Games in 1956, the University Games in Turin in 1970, the World University Track and Field Games in Rome in 1975 and the World University Alpine Winter Games in Livigno in 1976. He was Chairman of the Organizing Committee of the European Track and Field Championships held in Rome in 1974. Elected President of FIDAL in 1969, he has held this position ever since, being re-elected every four years. Since 1973 he has been a member of the Executive Committee of the Italian Olympic*

*Committee, (CONI). In 1976, he received the order of the "Gran Croce della Repubblica". In 1972, he was elected a Member of the I.A.A.F. Council, a position previously held by Bruno Zauli and Giorgio Oberweger. He was confirmed in that position in Montreal in 1976. In 1978, he was elected Vice-President of CONI. On the occasion of the World University Games in Mexico City, he received an honorary Law Degree in the University of Guadalajara. He was Chairman of the Organizing Committee of the World Cup 1981. That same year, in September he was elected President of the International Amateur Athletic Federation (I.A.A.F.). In 1983 he was elected President of the Association of Summer Olympic Sports (A.S.O.I.F.).*

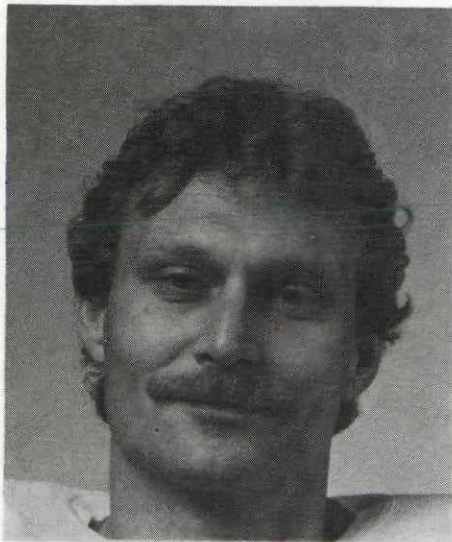

He gradually concentrated his interest and activity on the theoretical aspects of sports organization and is part of the managerial staff of the Italian Athletic Federation – specifically responsible for its Centre for Study and Research. His work includes being Editor-in-Chief of "Atleticastudi", the bi-monthly technical and scientific review published by the C. S. & R. FIDAL.*
