Looking forward to the conclusion of the World Athletics Indoor Tour

Despite the postponement of the World Athletics Indoor Championships, there is still plenty of indoor action to look forward to in 2020.

The <u>World Athletics Indoor Tour</u> got underway last weekend in Boston and continues this weekend in Karlsruhe. It heads to Dusseldorf on 4 February, Torun on 8 February, Glasgow on 15 February, before taking in the newest addition to the circuit, Lievin on 19 February. The final meeting on the World Athletics Indoor Tour will be held in Madrid on 21 February.

Many of the sport's leading stars have confirmed their attendance on the World Athletics Indoor Tour and almost all of the remaining meetings have sold out.
